HOW BIBLICAL IS GOOD FRIDAY?

Good Friday is a hoax! There is no possible way to reconcile "3 days and 3 nights in the heart of the earth" (Matthew 12:40) with a Friday crucifixion as illustrated to the right! Note that according to the Jews calendar, by the way, "the first day of the week" [Sunday] begins at sunset of what we call Saturday evening. Therefore, Jesus rose anytime from sunset Saturday evening, but before daybreak: this would then be the "first day of the week."


A DETAIL OF JESUS' LAST WEEK

THE LAST WEEK PRIOR TO THE RESURRECTION



Friday 9 Nisan - Before sunset Jesus comes to Bethany : It is 6 days before ************ passover. JOHN 12:1 passover lamb is set aside. EXODUS 12:3 JOHN 12:2-9 Sunday 11 Nisan - Jesus' Triumphal entry into Jerusalem. JOHN 12:12-19 MARK 11:1-11 MATTHEW 21:1-11 LUKE 19:28-40 Monday 12 Nisan - Jesus curses fig tree. MARK 11:12-19 MATTHEW 21:17-22{covers 12th and 13th} MARK 11:20 MARK 14:1-9 MATTHEW 26:1-13 MARK 14:10-25 MATTHEW 26:14-29 LUKE 22:1-23 JOHN 13:1-4 Jesus removed from the cross just before 6pm (sunset) and placed in tomb. MARK 15:1-47 LUKE 22:66-23:56 JOHN 18:27-19:42 MATTHEW 26:57-27:61 EXODUS 12:6 I CORINTHIANS 5:7,8 * NOTE * Feast of unleavened bread is called the Passover * LUKE 22:1 * REMEMBER * Each feast begins with a "holy convocation", or "sabbath", or "high day", which is not to be confused with the normal weekly sabbath which is saturday. EXODUS 12:16 LEVITICUS 23:7 JOHN 19:31{was not saturday, but the first day of the feast!-Thurs 15 Nisan) MATTHEW 27:62-66 Friday 16 Nisan - Jesus in tomb Saturday 17 Nisan - (weekly sabbath of rest) Jesus in tomb until at least 6pm:which is sunset. Sunday 18 Nisan - (first day of the week beginning by Jewish reckoning at sunset {6pm} saturday) Resurrection occures between 6pm saturday evening and 6am sunday morning. (Most likely nearer to 6pm saturday [see chart below]) MATTHEW 28 MARK 16 LUKE 24 JOHN 20(particularly v.1)

and notice that the tomb is ALREADY empty!

NOTE * contrast these 4 accounts VERY CAREFULLY: There are two trips made to the tomb by Mary Magdelene. JOHN 20:1- It was yet dark,
